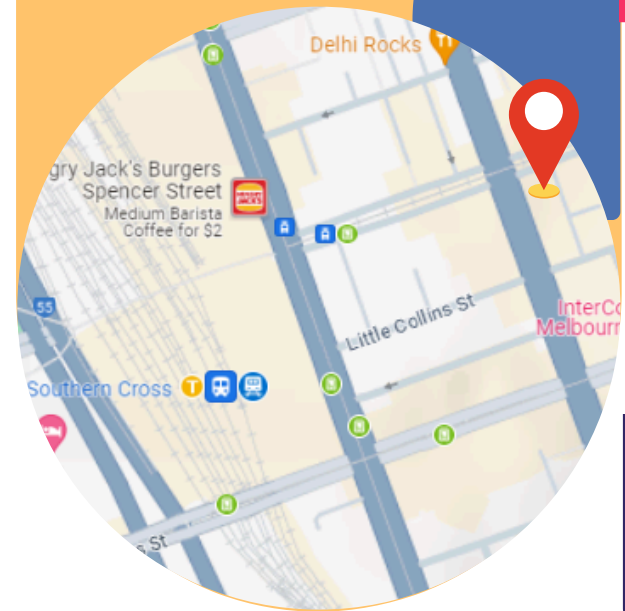
COURSE INFORMATION

At the Pre-Intermediate level, students understand ideas in familiar contexts and can write short, coherent texts about topics, goals and personal opinions. Improve language skills for effective communication in everyday situations.

At the advanced level, students effortlessly understand and summarise information from a variety of sources, presenting coherent arguments. They express themselves spontaneously and accurately even in complex situations.



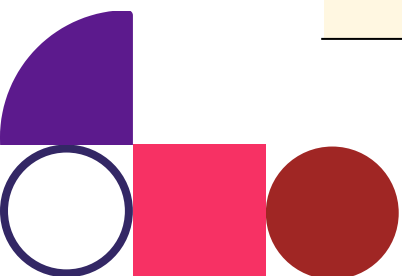
